a. City Energy Audit

Paulman reported on the research he had done on city energy audits.

Hager spoke to Brianna [Havir] today; Havir said that she needed a form to be signed by the city in order for the school to receive the grant money.

e. Arbor Day Planning

Przybylski reported the city contacted various businesses for sponsorship. Pearson said the event will happen right after the parade. Schletty listed the sponsors, (Compassionate Action for Animals, 110 Bicycles, Citizen Climate Lobby, MN DNR Wetland Program, the WSP Recycling Coordinator and the Environmental Committee) who have signed up to sponsor the event. There are 8 applications for the art portion.

- i. **Bid Opening, Marthaler Park Project** – A bid proposal will go before Council for approval at the next meeting. If the bid is approved, work will start in May.
- ii. **Park System Plan Update**- the city is working with a consultant to update the whole park system plan. A stakeholder meeting will be held next week and a park survey will be live online by the end of this week.
